



Day 10 Read: Galatians 1:11-2:3 This might seem like an obscure passage in the middle of our series. However, Paul had been given a word from the man who prayed for him to regain his sight after his encounter with Jesus himself. The word was “you are to be His witness to all of the world of what you have seen and heard” Acts 22:15. Over a decade later, he is still in Tarsus, away from the epicentre of Jerusalem, where he was studying and on a trajectory that everyone could see was to success. Now he is back in his hometown, and the New Testament mentions very little of this time. He is in his time of obscurity. You see, God can do something through us in a moment; but doing something in us is determined by our willingness to surrender to the process. We don’t know what was happening with Paul during that time, but we know that the word God had ordained for him was huge, so he had to sink deep roots down to hold up what he was going to carry. We are called to steward the now to our fullest ability. To not whinge about the time that it is taking, to not resent the process, but to be faithful in the season. Lord God, you say in Luke 16:10, that whoever is faithful in little will be faithful over much. *During this season Father, please teach me how to be faithful with what you have entrusted me with. Help me to use whatever I have to serve others, as a steward of your grace, as 1 Peter 4:10 says. Let me be generous according to 2 Corinthians 9:6-7, sowing generously out of what I have. Lord, I pray that I would steward the season you have me in, Amen.*
